

EMILIO BERTI

Emilio Berti is Full Professor of Dermatology at the School of Medicine, University of Milan, Italy and Director of the Dermatologic Unit of the Fondazione IRCCS Ca' Granda Ospedale Maggiore Policlinico in Milan. He has been head of Cutaneous Autoimmune and Cutaneous Lymphoma centre at Fondazione IRCCS Ca' Granda Ospedale Maggiore Policlinico since 1986.

He has been President of the M.I.A. (Light and Electron Microscopy and Image Analysis) Consortium of the University of Milano-Bicocca. He is member of the HLDA (Human Leukocytes Differentiation Antigens) group and he contributed to characterize by immunohistochemistry (tissue typing) monoclonal antibodies of the HLDA workshops from the 2nd to the last (10th).

He has published more than 250 indexed manuscripts and he set up the research group on Cutaneous Lymphoma at Fondazione IRCCS Ca' Granda Ospedale Maggiore Policlinico. He has contributed to describe several primary cutaneous lymphomas, including follicular B-cell lymphomas (Crosti's lymphomas, 1985), anaplastic large cells lymphomas (1987), CD8+ aggressive epidermotropic cytotoxic T-cell lymphoma, also known as "Berti's lymphoma" (1999), gamma/delta T-cell lymphoma (1991), and CD8+ subcutaneous panniculitis-like T-cell lymphoma (2006).

He as a member of the WHO/EORTC group contributed to the WHO/EORTC classification of primary cutaneous lymphomas (2005-2008-2016). He is member of the Italian Foundation Group for Lymphomas (FIL/GILC).
